



Assisted Living COVID-19 Reopening Plan

This mitigation plan establishes how Mountain View Assisted Living Home will open during the COVID-19 Pandemic. What we know about the COVID-19 disease will continue to change as scientists and researchers throughout the world learn and publish more information. Likewise, this mitigation plan will most likely change, and we greatly appreciate your assistance and patience as we adapt as we go. Future adjustments to reopening will be dependent on our local situation and are subject to direction from the Petersburg Borough and Unified Command.

The goal of this plan is to protect the health of our residents and staff while addressing feelings of loneliness and isolation in our residents. This plan seeks to keep residents, staff, and visitors healthy. It doesn't allow for hugs but it does take away the separation.

In addition, other things may impact the home's ability to offer visitation. The amount of community spread COVID-19, clusters of cases occurring in locations near the home, or staffing availability all could delay or change visitation in the home. The following visitation plan will begin with offering scheduled visitation (over and above essential workers) starting with up to 4 visitors per resident at a time.

We continue to follow a strict sick leave policy for all staff which may include COVID-19 testing. All staff is required to fill out a daily screening questionnaire and daily temperature checks. All residents will also continue to have temperatures taken daily and we continue to monitor residents for COVID-19 symptoms.

Please carefully read the following visiting instructions and note that if you are going to visit the home you must be prepared to submit to a temperature check and screening questionnaire. If you have traveled at ALL within the past 14 days or have any signs of illness, please DO NOT ENTER. If you have had a positive



COVID-19 test whether symptomatic or asymptomatic you need to provide proof of clearance by a public health official before entering.

VISITING MOUNTAIN VIEW ASSISTED LIVING

-Visiting hours are 9 am to 8 pm. Please call 772-2445 or 518-0528 to schedule a visit.

-A maximum of 4 visitors per resident at once. All visits will take place in the resident's apartment or outside the facility.

-Visitors will have their temperature taken, and be screened for symptoms of COVID-19 when they arrive at the home and will not be allowed to enter if symptoms are identified. The screening form will include the necessary information needed for contact tracing such as date, printed name, and signature in the event there is a positive case.

-Visitors are required to wear a face mask (without a valve) or cloth face covering. Masks will need to be worn at all times while in the home. If you don't have a mask one will be provided.

-Hands need to be sanitized by visitors before and after visiting. Hand sanitizing gel will be provided.

-Visitors will need to maintain 6 feet between the resident, as well as 6 feet between each visitor if not from the same household. Our 1 & 2 bedroom apartments easily allow for this social distancing.

-Visitors need to go promptly to the resident's apartment striving to have minimal contact with any other residents, visitors, or staff.

-Any meals shared with a resident will take place in the resident's apartment. Visitors need to request a meal at least 24 hours in advance, and must keep the 6 foot distance, mask before and after the meal, and good hand hygiene.

-Minor children must be under direct supervision by the adults who bring them.



-The entry way and apartments will be sanitized with disinfectant immediately by staff after each visit. This will include all flat surfaces and “high touch” areas.

-Length of visit, and time and frequency of visits may be limited to allow all family and friends the opportunity to visit. Limit 3 apartments at a time. Please be respectful of others by showing up on time and leaving on time.

-In the event of a positive test in the facility or from a recent visitor, all visitation will be immediately cancelled until further notice.

-If anyone has been actively recovering from confirmed or suspected COVID-19, they will not be allowed to visit until: At least 3 days (72 hours) have passed since recovery defined as resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications and improvement in respiratory symptoms (e.g., cough, shortness of breath); and, at least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared and cleared by a public health official.

-If a resident has been actively recovering from COVID-19, visits will be allowed once the resident has not symptoms and has been cleared by a public health official.

-If a visitor is unable to follow any of these guidelines, the visitor may not be scheduled for another visit.

*Residents are able to leave the facility. Masks, social distancing, avoiding large gatherings, and good hand hygiene are strongly encouraged while out.
